County Council Meeting

July 18, 2022

Spartanburg County Council met on Monday, July 18, 2022, in the County Council Chambers, 366 N. Church Street, Spartanburg, SC, at 5:15 p.m. The following attended: Honorable Manning Lynch, Chairman; Honorables Jack Mabry, David Britt, Justin McCorkle, Bob Walker, and Jessica Coker, Council Members; along with Cole Alverson, County Administrator; Earl Alexander, Deputy County Administrator; Kevin Stiens, Assistant County Administrator; John Harris, County Attorney, and Ryan Gaylord, Deputy County Attorney. Honorable Monier Abusoft, Council Member, was absent.

In compliance with the Freedom of Information Act, notice of this meeting was provided in advance to the local news media and other interested parties.

Meeting was live streamed via YouTube. Links and instructions for how to access this meeting via computer or mobile device were made available on the County's webpage and provided to the local media.

I.

Chairman Lynch called the meeting to order.

II.

Invocation was rendered by Chaplain Tyrone Jackson.

III.

Honorable Bob Walker led the Pledge of Allegiance.

IV.

Kevin Stiens, Assistant County Administrator, recognized Tamika Pollard, Parks and Recreation Department, for her dedication and continued professionalism with the summer ACE (After Class Enrichment) program at Inman Elementary School.

Motion made by Mr. Britt to approve the minutes of June 20, 2022 (Regular Meeting). Motion seconded by Mr. Mabry and carried.

- A. Chairman Lynch declared open a public hearing to consider an Ordinance authorizing the execution and delivery of a Fee in Lieu of Tax Agreement by and between Spartanburg County, South Carolina and **TRIP 1 USICV, LLC** (Project TRIP North - Lot 4). No one appeared, and the matter was closed.

VIII.

Motion made by Mr. Mabry to appoint Deborah "Tudi" Holmes, Realtor, to the Community Development Department Housing Loan Committee. Motion seconded by Mr. Britt and carried.

IX.

Charlie Hodge, Chairman, Downtown Airport Advisory Board; Terry Connorton, Airport Director; Chris Birkmeyer, PE, WK Dickson & Co.; and Eric Anderson, Financer, presented an update on the Spartanburg Downtown Memorial Airport. (Presentation included in backup) Mr. Connorton stated that every week he receives phone calls from various businesses that would like to relocate to the Downtown Airport. They are one of the last locations in the Upstate that has room to build hangars. Mr. Birkmeyer illustrated some of the opportunities at the Downtown Airport to build hangars to generate more business. The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) approved an Airport Layout Plan to build approximately 257,000 square feet of new hangar space. This is contiguous area. The approximate cost of the infrastructure to allow this future development would be about \$4 million. Mr. Anderson talked about the financial portion of this and the benefits from having a development of this size. Mr. Anderson has a company in Maryland, and he wants to come down here. He has worked with Mr. Connorton several years and has put approximately \$100,000 into this project so far locally to get drawings done, civil engineering plats, etc. to help facilitate this on their end. Within the first 24 months, we would be looking at 20 to 25 new jobs. Our breakeven point within the first 12 months is 23 jobs. Over the course of six years, we are looking at 150 to 200 new jobs. These are primary manufacturing, maintenance, and overhaul jobs. These are people that are highly skilled with an average pay between \$75,000 and \$95,000 a year. When you look at spin off jobs, this project would bring in between 1,000 to 2,000 total jobs across the board. This also plays into BMW and other manufacturers looking to pull in aviation assets. Mr. Anderson was at the meeting to back up Mr. Connorton and the airport's position as to why this infrastructure is a good fit. A specific dollar amount was not requested at this time. Chairman Lynch asked that specifics be brought back to Council later. They would be

interested in knowing what the City of Spartanburg is doing on this. Council was receptive and interested. Mr. Hodge stated the City has given them a fairly clear indication that they can direct the use of monies they generate positively. They already have a match idea in place if they can gain some infrastructure help from the County.

X.

Cole Alverson, County Administrator, presented an Animal Services Update. Council and Staff have been discussing how to go about having an orderly transition away from Greenville County Animal Care. Staff has procured the services of engaged a consultant, Dr. Sara Pazano to help us understand the lay of the land in Spartanburg County as it relates to Animal Services. By and large, for at least the recent past, we have been relying on other providers to help us navigate those waters. Dr. Pazano has begun the data collection process. She has met with Greenville County Animal Care and a number of different providers within the County to understand what services they provide, the volumes they typically see, and the challenges they are currently facing in an effort to get a clear picture of the landscape of Animal Service providers in Spartanburg County today to therefore understand what role the County may have going forward and what her recommendations will be. She has also done a fair amount of research looking at State Statutes, looking at the Ordinances that County Council, either this body or prior bodies, have put in place. She is in the process of coming up with some recommendations from a policy standpoint on things she thinks Council should consider in an effort to try to keep animals out of Animal Sheltering facilities. Those sorts of policies could directly impact the size of the facility we may ultimately need to consider building. She is working through her process. A preliminary report is expected and hopefully a final report back from her middle to late August. Therefore, Staff can begin to have some substantive conversations with Council about policy considerations Administration thinks Council should deliberate, and the report from her will also provide recommendations in terms of what a facility could look like, the size, the cost, etc. in order to really begin to understand the challenge before us.

- A. Alysa Handelsman, PhD, Assistant Professor of Anthropology, Wofford College, and Dr. Jennifer Bradham, Assistant Professor of Environmental Studies, Wofford College, presented information in reference to the presence and impact of condemned and abandoned properties in Una, Saxon, and Arcadia on neighborhood residents. (Presentation and handout included in backup) The Una, Saxon, and Arcadia Revitalization Committee asked Dr. Handelsman if she could help their committee's organizing efforts by collecting more data on condemned and abandoned properties. Preliminary data has been collected for the last five months through research classes. This summer, they received a research grant from Wofford College. They have nine amazing student researchers who have been working hard. Some of them attended the meeting. While their primary research question looks at the impacts of condemned and abandoned properties on neighborhood residents, this project has grown in the last few months. The structure of the project was presented. The research team has gone to 500 homes across Una, Saxon, and Arcadia conducting door-to-door surveys. They have spoken to 80 residents. Listening Session have been held, and they have also attended neighborhood meetings. Participatory Mapping/Photovoice Camp Sessions were held capturing youth voices/perspective on their neighborhoods. Dr. Bradham presented maps showing areas visited. They are plotting where the condemned properties are located and looking for any patterns. They are also looking at property ownership. Dr. Handelsman stated some of the emerging themes from the preliminary data are SAFE spaces for youth; improved roads, sidewalks, speed bumps, new stop signs; grocery store/fruit and vegetable stand; and affordable home repairs. Next steps include comparative map of "No Trespassing"; coding qualitative data for emergent themes; increased outreach with the Latino community; support for community organizations; and support for after-school programming. Mr. Britt discussed the changes in Spartanburg since the seventies. The textile community evaporated. You had a community that did not have jobs. Council has tried to drive hope and opportunity through jobs. Mr. Britt expressed his appreciation for the students doing this work and giving hope to the residents. Ms. Coker also expressed her appreciation. Mr. McCorkle thanked the students for their work and stated that often constituents in the rural areas do not feel like anyone cares. These initiatives are going to be important.

Mr. McDaniel is a commercial realtor in Spartanburg. A year or so ago, there was an industrial Park called B&H Industrial Park developed by Mackie Horton. His family owns some of the buildings still in the Park, and they desire to sell them, so they hired Mr. McDaniel to try to start selling the buildings. They have the buildings that were available either sold or under contract with the exception of one building. The unsold building is located at 114 Belton Drive. Pictures of buildings in the Park were passed out to Council. The building is 63,000 square feet. Mr. McDaniel agreed to purchase the building if it was worth refurbishing. They decided to seek an Abandoned Building Site tax credit on the building. The building has been vacant since 2009. Motion made by Ms. Coker to adopt Resolution. A. **Capital Penny Phase I Update** was presented by Cole Alverson, County Administrator. Mr. Alverson stated quite a few things have changed at the Courthouse. Our steel work is nearly complete. Our actual steel subcontractors are beginning to demobilize. All that is left in terms of steel is a few little final finishing details and also the building of the portico, which will occur a little later this fall once they get further along in the project. A topping out ceremony will be held in the fall when the final beam of the portico is placed. In terms of the rest of the construction, the precast installation continues and is looking great. It is all coming together very nicely. Inside of the building, all of our subcontractors continue their work from the northern side of the building all the way to the south. There are various amounts of framing going up. The fireproofing is going up. Spray foam installation is going up for the interior. The window contractor has mobilized. Window panels will start to go in over the next few weeks. All of the slabs are done with the exception of a couple of areas at the ground level as well as the second slab that is nearest to the QS1 building. You can walk freely within the site safely on concrete floors. The construction site itself remains

busy. There are about 150 to 170 construction workers on any given day on our site carrying out their individual trades.

As it relates to the Emergency Operations Center (EOC), our exterior façade is nearly complete. It looks really good. We are awaiting delivery of two rooftop units for our Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC). We have some temporary units in place. They are doing interior drywall and a lot of the electrical finish work. They are beginning work on the network cabling. They are getting very close to completion of the facility. Our EOC building should be complete within the next couple of months. The City of Spartanburg's Police Building is primarily under their purview. They are in the process of getting some site work done.

Mr. Alverson extended his thanks to First Sergeant Leonard at the Detention Facility who helps compile a lot of the footage for the video along with Scottie Kay Blackwell who helps put all this together.

Budget Amendment Number 23001 amends the Authorized Staffing for FY23 for the Sheriff's Office. Budget Amendment Number 23002 accepts a grant from the Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation to Trinity Fire Department for extrication equipment.

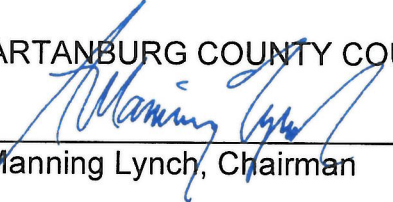
